Inmate GED scores near record pace

Thirty-eight inmates from the Alachua County Jail have passed their GED tests in 2009. So far this year, 32 adults and six juveniles have passed their tests.

Last year, 43 inmates (37 adults and 6 juveniles) passed their GED tests, surpassing the totals for 2006 and 2007 combined. In addition to receiving their GED's, only one inmate (of the 43 who passed) had re-offended and returned to the jail within six months of being released, further highlighting the value of an education in aiding offenders with successful re-entry to society after their incarceration.

Twenty-two inmates (20 adults and 2 juveniles) passed their General Educational Development (GED) tests in 2007. In 2006, fifteen inmates obtained GED's while at the jail.

The average grade level for those tested in 2008 was the fourth grade. Their average length of their stay at the jail was 40-60 days.

All general population inmates are eligible to improve their educational skills through a partnership with the Alachua County School Board. After completing the Test of Adult Basic Education, GED preparation is provided for those inmates without a high school diploma who test at or above the ninth grade level. Those who test below the ninth grade level in one or more of three subject areas (reading, writing and math) are given intensive pre-GED preparation to get them to the level to take GED classes.
