Media Advisory: Inmate labor savings top \$19,450 in June

In June, inmate work squads from the Alachua County Jail worked on a variety of projects that saved county taxpayers more than \$19,450. Last month, the squads:

- Cleared brush and removed debris from ditches for the City of Waldo.
- Trimmed trees and brush for the Gainesville Housing Authority.
- Trimmed trees for the City of Archer.
- Conducted landscaping for the Santa Fe College Institute for Public Safety.
- Cut brush and limbs at the Ironwood Golf Course.
- Painted houses for the Alachua County Housing Authority in Hawthorne.

In June, the squads performed 1,486 hours of labor for a savings of \$19,451.74. In April, the jail added a second work crew to perform additional work projects. So far this year, the squads have performed 6,673 hours of work for a savings of \$67,897.83. Last year, the squads performed 5,994 hours of labor for a savings of \$78,461.46.

In 2008, the squads performed 6,378 hours of work for a savings of \$83,488.02, according to the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation (AWI). From October through December 2007, a total of 677.5 hours of inmate labor were reported for a savings of \$8,868.48. Since the squads were initiated in October 2007, they have created a total combined savings to taxpayers of \$250,784.77.

AWI determines the value of work by multiplying the hourly wage value of \$13.09 by the total number of hours worked. The hourly wage value is based on a base rate of pay. They do not include holiday pay, overtime pay and shift differential pay, vacation pay or any other benefits such as health insurance benefits, profit sharing, stock bonuses, tuition repayments, or meal payments. The base hourly wage is determined from the Florida Occupational Wages 2007 Edition prepared by AWI. For more information on work squad programs, call Lt.
